Ministers from Least Developed Countries Commit to Ambitious Climate Action and Call for Global Community

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USPA NEWS - Ministers and Heads of Delegation from the Least Developed Countries (LDC) group met in Addis Ababa to discuss the priorities of the LDC group in preparation for the international climate negotiations in Bonn, Germany in November 2017.

Mr. Gebru Jember Endalew, Chair of the LDC Group, said it had been a very successful meeting, with Ministers discussing all of the key issues of the negotiations and expressing their countries' dedication to ambitious climate action. "Today Ministers from across the world's 47 poorest countries have demonstrated how LDCs are continuing to take the lead on ambitious climate action, pursuing sustainable, low carbon and climate resilient pathways to protect our people and our planet."

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"Under the Paris Agreement the world has laid out a vision for achieving a greener, healthier and brighter future for all - the LDCs hope that the upcoming negotiations will generate finance and other support to ensure all countries of the world can make this vision a reality." The LDC group are fully committed to supporting Fiji, the first island nation to hold the presidency of the Conference of the Parties, to reach successful outcomes this November.

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
